



TASL GAME DAY REQUIREMENTS

It is your responsibility to understand and comply with the following game day requirements.

These requirements are strictly enforced.

- All teams must have:
 - Uniforms with numbers on them
 - Alternate uniforms available in case of a conflict
- Before the start of each game, the Team Captain, or designated representative, must submit the following information to the referee:
 - A roster with team members names and their uniform numbers. This can be printed from the TASL web site.
 - A three-part Match Report pre-filled with the basic game information.
- Referees are responsible for checking rosters, uniforms, jewelry, and shin guards before the start of the game. Please ensure your teammates are prepared for the referee check. If the referee is not performing this check, make a note on the Match Report under "Comments".

Before the start of the game, referees will check each player against the team roster. At check-in, players must:

- Be wearing their uniform with the number listed on the team roster
 - Present their NCASA player pass to the referee. If a player does not have a card they will not be allowed to play. For more information on the NCASA player pass, see NCASA player pass.
- Players arriving late must present their NCASA player card to the assistant referee before entering the field.
 - After the game, both Team Captains should receive a copy of the Match Report for their records. Keep all Match Reports until the end of the season. Make sure the referee names are on the report.
 - Team Captains are responsible for retrieving players' NCASA player pass from referees after the game (except for any red carded player).

Please note: Captains are no longer required to report scores.
